4. First-aid measures

Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Provide general supportive measures and treat symptomatically. Treatment of phosphate overdose may include the following: Support respiratory and cardiovascular function. Monitor fluid and electrolyte status, including serum phosphate, calcium, potassium, sodium, and magnesium concentrations. Obtain an ECG and institute continuous cardiac monitoring. Do not induce vomiting because of the potential for CNS depression, seizures, and cardiovascular instability. Due to molecular size and ionic dissociation, charcoal is NOT likely to be beneficial. Consider gastric lavage after a potentially life threatening ingestion if it can be performed soon after ingestion (generally within 60 minutes). For diarrhea: Restrict solid food and maintain high fluid intake until diarrhea resolves. Oral fluids should consist of hypotonic solution containing appropriate electrolytes. Coma, lethargy, or CNS depression may be a result of dehydration and will respond to fluid replacement. Correct hypocalcemia, hypernatremia, hyperphosphatemia, hypomagnesemia, and hyperkalemia or hypokalemia as needed. For seizures: Attempt initial control with a benzodiazepine (diazepam or lorazepam). If seizures persist or recur administer phenobarbital. For hypotension: Infuse isotonic fluid and place patient in Trendelenburg position. If hypotension persists, administer dopamine or norepinephrine. Consider central venous pressure monitoring to guide further fluid therapy. For bradycardia: Treat with atropine.

General information

Remove from exposure. Remove contaminated clothing.
